### Museum Park

About 400 years ago, the current location of the National Museum of Taiwan History (NMTH) was a great bay known as the "Taijiang Inner Sea." In this historic place, we inherit the mission of telling the stories of Taiwan. The 20-hectare "Museum Park" features a variety of Taiwan's native species as well as public art, venerable trees, and lakes that creates a serene space in which to learn about Taiwan's ecosystem.

### 1 Tree of Gratitude

A memorial to commemorate the selfless sacrifice of foreign nationals who gave their lives to Taiwan.

### 2 Cloud Wall

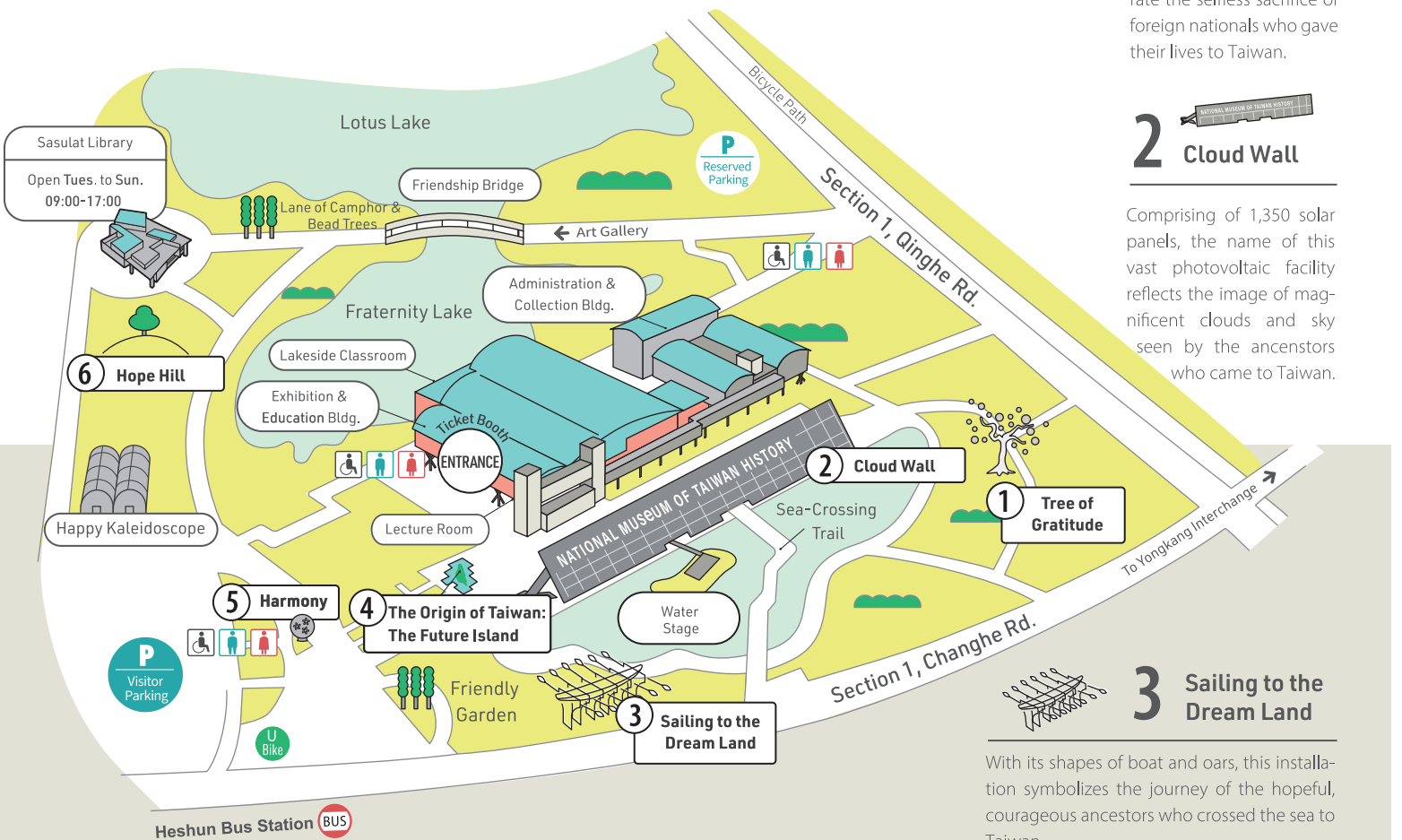
Comprising of 1,350 solar panels, the name of this vast photovoltaic facility reflects the image of magnificent clouds and sky seen by the ancestors who came to Taiwan.

### 3 Sailing to the Dream Land

With its shapes of boat and oars, this installation symbolizes the journey of the hopeful, courageous ancestors who crossed the sea to Taiwan.

### 4 The Origin of Taiwan: The Future Island

This ground-embedded public art displays a digitally re-rendered satellite image of Taiwan in its original state, expressing the wish to restore the island's native ecosystem.



### 6 Hope Hill

Rising 23 meters above sea level and recognized as "the highest peak in Annan," it offers panoramic views of the NMTH Museum Park and surrounding vistas.

### 5 Harmony

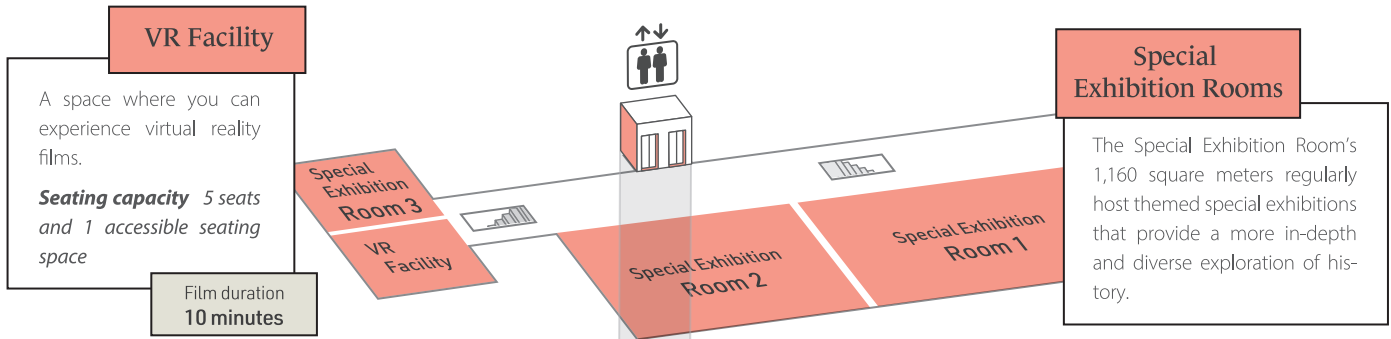
This artwork transforms paper-cutting techniques to represent species familiar to the many cultures of Taiwan, including the broad-tailed swallowtail butterfly, indigenous cinnamon, Formosa lily, Taiwan rhododendron, Taiwan cherry, Phalaenopsis aphrodite, and Taiwan hibiscus. At night, the illumination system presents a beautiful lightshow.

## About the NMTH

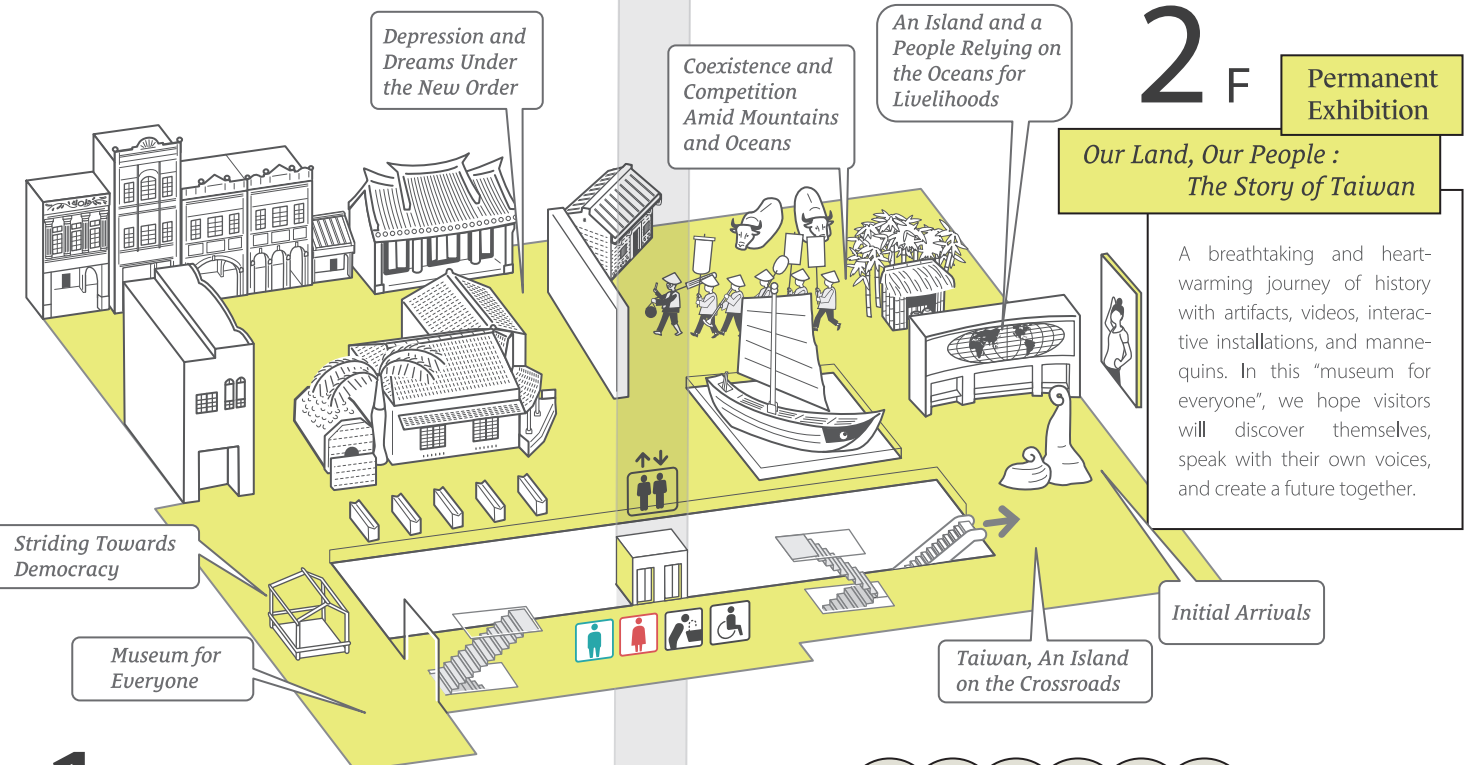

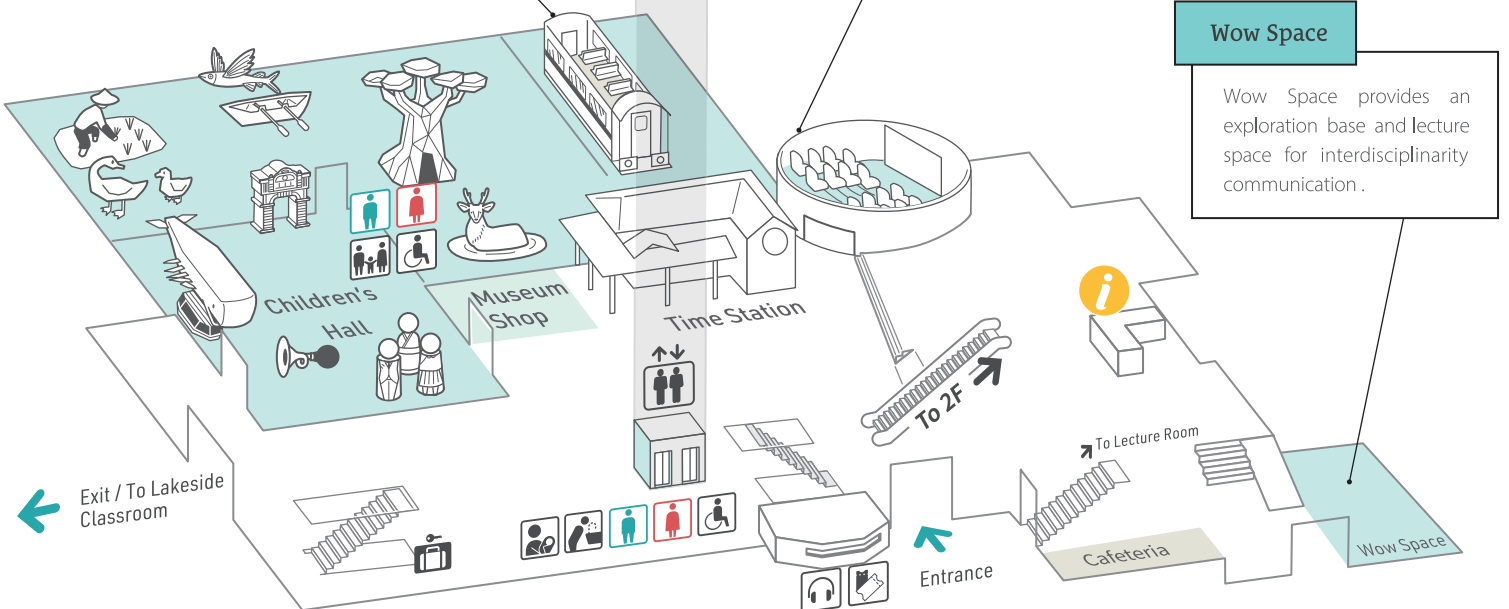
Lectures, workshops, seminars, and film screenings are held here from time to time.
