

Although the city's defensive walls have been demolished, most of its gates are still standing along Zhongshan S. Road, Zhongxiao W. Road, Zhonghua Road, and Aiguo W. Road. Strolling along these streets, catch glimpses of what this city once looked like. Taipei's cityscapes have undergone major transformations over the past century, creating a mix of old and new. Starting from National Taiwan Museum's Main Building, explore historic sites and landmarks and taste local delicacies. The National Taiwan Museum (NTM) is the oldest existing museum in Taiwan. Located in the Walled City of Taipei, NTM boasts a collection of 110,000 items related to Taiwan's culture, flora, fauna, and

geology. Since its foundation, based on its mission as a natural history museum, this museum has dutifully collected, researched, exhibited and promoted Taiwan's natural resources, culture, and history,

making it a cradle of modern knowledge on Taiwan. The "Capital's Core District: The Taiwan Museum System Program", Jaunched in 2005, incorporates several buildings inside and outside old Taipei

into the city's museum network, including historical buildings such as the Natural History Branch (formerly the Taipei branch of Dai-Ichi Kangyo Bank), the Nanmen Branch, and the Railway Department

**Beimen Post Office**


# Snow King Ice Cream
